Miami Grand Prix 2023

After issues in Q3, Max Verstappen was forced to start at ninth on the grid, far behind Red Bull teammate Sergio Perez, who took pole. Yet within 15 laps, Verstappen was just behind Perez and the Red Bull 1-2 commanded the attention of the 270,000 strong crowd. Tyre changes dictated the end result, giving Verstappen his third win of the 2023 season.
